Morning Classes Educational

This morning, briefly before lunch, everyone had the amazing opportunity to participate in the college fair, along with an activity presented by the state police bomb squad division and a drinking and driving simulator.

For those of you that didn't attend, the college fair was held in the Main Pavilion. It had numerous tables set up to represent a certain college, the following representing institutions: Bethany College, Bluefield State College, Concord University, Fairmont State University, Davis and Elkins College, Marshall University, Glenville State College, Potomac State College of WVU, Shepherd University, West Liberty State University, West Virginia University, Wheeling **Jesuit** University, West Virginia State University, Virginia West Wesleyan College, Bridgewater College, West Point USMA, Berea College, Ohio Valley University, and Salem International University.

Also the FBI, the Army, and the National Guard represented their organizations trying to recruit new member.

From each of those colleges there were representatives that supplied information involving all of the

activities and campus life that that college had to offer. They patiently listened and answered any questions that we had about that particular college.

They also hoped to recruit us as part of their student body once we graduate high school. For anyone that was interested in that institution, they gave us a postcard for us to fill out with our personal information so they can supply us with further details about the college, like possible college tour dates.

The next activity was the presentation given by the state police bomb squad division. They gave us an introduction about themselves and their careers.

Then they displayed the bomb detonator robot that had two shotgun barrels attached to its side. Towards the end of the presentation they showed us a box. They explained a scenario where they had to open a cardboard box, but that they feared that a bomb could detonate as soon as they opened it.

They had a shotgun with a blank in it; however, the blank was filled with water. When

everyone was at a safe enough distance away, the electrical powered shotgun fired cutting the card board box in half without opening it the traditional way and without touching the dynamite that was contained in the box. This makes this the newest, safest method for opening bomb boxes.

Finally the last activity was the drunk driving simulator. Prior to this there was a presentation given by a state trooper on distracted driving. So they wanted to show us just how dangerous drinking and driving is, at first when you step in the trailer where the simulator was located you see a computer monitor displaying how the other person was doing.

When they first started to drive they were sober, but as time progressed the BAC (blood alcohol content) increased by just 0.02 until it was at 0.08. Actions became incredibly difficult, your reaction time slowed as well as the steering and the breaking. The simulation was approximately four minutes long. It really taught us why we should never drink and drive.
