Pledge of Allegiance Title 4 U.S. Code § 4

"I pledge allegiance to the Flag of the United States of America, and to the Republic for which it stands, one Nation under God, indivisible, with liberty and justice for all."

The Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag of the United States of America should be rendered by standing at attention facing the flag with the right hand over the heart.

When not in uniform men prisoners, the full should remove any non-religious accounting for the headdress with their right hand and repatriation of all hold it at the left shoulder, the hand remains of those being over the heart.

Persons in uniform should remain silent, face the flag, and render the military salute.

Members of the Armed Forces not in uniform and veterans may render the military salute in the manner provided for persons in uniform.

On this day there are ceremonies throughout the nation for remembrance of the fallen or unreturned, so as not to let the public forget.

The League's sole purpose is to obtain the release of all prisoners, the fullest possible accounting for the missing and repatriation of all recoverable remains of those who died serving our nation.

Michael D. Buss is a Deputy Director in the Americanism Division of The American Legion National Headquarters in Indianapolis, Indiana. Buss oversees The American Legion's Boys State and Boys Nation programs, The American Legion Baseball program, the flag education and etiquette program, and is the National Organization's representative to the United States Olympic Committee.

Buss joined the National Headquarters staff in April 1995. He was promoted to deputy director in May 2010 having previously served as an assistant director managing The American Legion's Youth Programs.

Buss is a 1978 graduate of Iowa State University, where he was a four-year Navy ROTC scholarship student, studying journalism and history. He also pursued advanced studies in journalism during his tour of duty as a member of the Navy ROTC staff at the University of Nebraska-Lincoln from 1983-1986, serving an an associate professor of Naval Science.

Buss was a commissioned Naval Officer attaining the rank of Lieutenant Commander. He was a surface warfare officer, serving in a variety of assignments both afloat and ashore. Upon his release from active duty in 1993, he served a year and a half in the Ready Reserves, as the executive officer of a ship unit, Naval Reserve Center, Lincoln, Nebraska. He was honorably discharged from the Inactive Ready Reserve force in 2002. Buss' awards and decorations include the Meritorious Service Medal, Navy Commendation Medal, National Defense Service Medal, in addition to other ship and unit awards. He is also a member of the St. Barbara Field Artillery Society, having been inducted in 1989 while serving as the Brigade Fire Support Officer for the First Marine Expeditionary Brigade in Hawaii.

Buss is a member of Merle Hay Post 386 of Glidden, Iowa and is a 1973 graduate of Iowa Hawkeye American Legion Boys State. He is also very active in youth sports where he is an accomplished baseball umpire at all levels of competition. Additionally he serves as a lector and extraordinary minister for his church, St Monica Catholic Church.

Buss, a native of Glidden, Iowa, lives in Indianapolis with his wife Marie. They are the parents of four grown children and have 20 grandchildren and three great-grandchildren.

On March 26, 2012, Jamie Summerlin, a US Marine Corps veteran, started an improbable cross-country journey. In order to honor our Military Veterans, and raise funds for West Virginia-based Operation Welcome Home, a veteran's facility "For Veterans, By Veterans", he would run coast to coast beginning in Coos Bay, Oregon. After 100 days, 10 pairs of running shoes, 3,452 miles, and impacting countless lives along the way, Jamie completed his journey in Rehoboth Beach, Delaware, becoming the 48th person in history to complete a true Ocean to Ocean run across America.

Jamie is the founder and Race Director of the WVU Medicine Morgantown Marathon, and also serves as the Event Manager for the Wild & Wonderful MountainFest Motorcycle Rally.
