With preliminaries out of the way, the 19th annual Boys' State gets underway today as candidates for state offices file with the Secretary of State at Harrison County.

The primary election will follow the assembly program tonight.

Results of the primary will be reported in tomorrow's Mountaineer.

The registration of 347 citizens yesterday afternoon brings the all-time total attendance at Boys' State to 6,522.

Details of your activities here this week are being reported to newspapers and radio stations all over the state. The folks back home will be following your progress here.

Gov. Burt Dudding is to preside at all functions of the '56 Boys State until the newly elected governor takes over.

The preliminary delegation of counselors arrived here Saturday afternoon with a few citizens and a great amount of rain. Final ceremonies will be staged at the assembly program Saturday morning.

Voting machines will be used again this year although only for state offices. Voting for other offices will be on paper ballots.
