One of the features in the primary was a stovepipe hat worn by Honest Dave Loomy, a candidate for governor. Other election presentations followed a regular pattern. Counselors who saw the hat recalled the coonskin cap worn by a candidate a few years ago.

## AT MONDAY ASSEMBLY
