The amount of food shoveled in by Boys Staters this week sets record of some kind for a week's volume at the Mill.

JOURNAL OF THE STATE SENATE

REGULAR SESSION 1956

Jackson's Mill

June 8, 1956

The Senate met at 10:00 A.M.

The following prayer was offered to Tom Lilly, Clerk:

"Our Heavenly Father, we give thanks today for these men who have been selected to be in our Senate. May their presence be beneficial to all participants of Mountaineer Boys State. Guide our thoughts, actions and meditation throughout this session, and may our decisions be concluded in a Christian attitude. Guide and direct each of us, for we ask it in Christ's name and for his sake. Amen."

Pending the reading of the Journal of yesterday, on motion of Mr. Warren, the Journal was approved and the further reading thereof dispensed with.

Mr. Walker (Mr. President) introduced Mr. E. G. Bias, Law and Courts Counselor, and asked that he be extended the privileges of the floor for the day, which leave was granted; whereupon, Mr. Bias made a short address for the Senate.

Mr. Yoho, from the Committee on Finance, reported that his committee had had under consideration Senate Bill $^{\rm N}$ o. 1 (Budget Bill), and reported the same back with the recommendation that it do pass.

On motion of the same gentleman, unanimous consent beign given, the bill was taken up for immediate consideration, read a first time and ordered to second reading.

On further motion of the same gentleman, the constitutional rule requiring the the bill to be fully and distinctly read on three different days was dispensed with by a vote of four-fifths of the members present, taken by yeas and nays.

On motion of the same gentleman, unanimous consent being given, the resolution was taken up for immediate consideration, read a first time and ordered to second reading.

On the further motion of the same gentleman, the constitutional rule requiring the resolution to be fully and distinctly read on three different days was dispensed with a vote of four-fifths of the members present, taken by yeas and nays.

Mr. Urso introduced Counselor Steele Callison and asked that he be extended the privileges of the floor for the day, which leave was granted.

A message from the House of Delegates by Mr. Viller (Mr. Speaker), announced the adoption by that body and requested the concurrence of the Senate in the adoption of House Joint Resolution No. 1, relating to various and sundry matters.

(Mr. Warron in the Chair)

Mr. Walker (Mr. President) offered the following resolution:

Senato Concurrent Resolution No. 3 -- "Providing for period of prayor."

Rosolved by the Senate, the House of Delegates concurring therein:

That the daily schedule of activities therein provide for a brief period of personal prayer and meditation. The time of said period to be determined by the Chief Counselor, in order to make our camp better and to make more highly respected citizens.

On motion of the same gentleman, the resolution was taken up for immediate consideration and adopted. Ordered, that Mr. Walker (Mr. President) communicate to the House of Delegates the action of the Senate and request concurrence therein.

Mr. Walker (Mr. President) offered the following resolution:

That we keep alive an active association with alumni.
