Voting for all other offices will be on paper ballots in each county under direction of the counselor and the election officials as established by law.

A complete round of volley ball and baseball games, plus track and swimming has been planned by Ath letic Director John Cox.

With preliminaries out of the way the 20 th annual Boys State gets underway today as candidates for the top state offices file with the Secretary of State at Harrison.

The primary election will follow tonight's assembly program and the polls will close at 10 o'clock.Results in detail willcappear in this newspaper tomorrow.

The registration 348 citizens yesterday brings the all-time attendance at Boys State to 6,870.

News being made here this week is being reported to both Assoc iated Press and United Press and is being rereceived by every newspaper, radio and tele-vision station in the state.

Gov. John Frye will preside at all Boys State activities until his successor is chosen tomorrow evening.

At yesterday's opening meeting, Staters were greeted by Frye, Chief Counselor Fugitt E. D. Hardman, department commander of American Legion, and R. A. "Rat" Thom, the the camp director and only 20-year member of staff.

Voting machines will again be used this year but only for state offices in the general election Tuesday.

Pre-election activity began in earnest last night with the meeting of the two state exective committees. Candidates made their way to GHQ to pick up sign material for the short campaign tomorrow.

The first signs were up by suppertime yes terday.

Membership of the state committees is shown on page two of today's Mountaineer. groups are working on party platforms and on plans for the general election.
