WEBSTER LEADS STATE IN CABIN INSPECTION

After one of the loudest assembly programs in many years, the 1957 Boys Staters headed for the polls last night to nominate as leaders National Ronald Lee Floyd and Federalist John Frank Kile.

Tonight's general election will pick the governor to succeed John Frye.

Last night Chief Counselor Fugitt gave all Staters a chance to yell for 15 minutes, and they obliged with a roar that lasted almost the full period. Leaders of both political parties alternated in leading cheers as the members whistled, yelled, and stomped.

In brief remarks following the demonstration, Mr. Fugitt said he didn't believe all that was written about teenagers. He expressed regrets that some people disregard both adult delinquency and juvenile decency.

Gov. Frye followed with an account of his experiences at Boys Nation last year. He also paid tribute to Mr. Fugitt as a leader, a college sports star and an honor graduate.

After a whispered consultation with the two party chairmen, Mr. Fugitt announced that no speeches would be heard at last night's meeting. The assembly was dismissed and Staters headed back to their counties to begin voting about 8:45 p.m.

PRIMARY TICKET

Frank Hartman, Nationalist of Gilmer County, filed yesterday for both the Supreme Court and State Auditor. This is permissible by custom in Boys State. Hartman, however, is the first person to win both offices for which he filed. Last night he was given a choice of being certified to the General Election on only one of the offices. He selected the office of State Auditor and withdrew from the race for Supreme Court. He was replaced by the next highest candidate, Richard Hadsell, Nationalist of Barbour County.
