The state's highest office went to the Federalist party in yester-day's election but the Nationalist broom swept every other office.
"Mark your 'x' for Tex" was a successful slogan for newly-elected governor, John "Tex" Kile but it failed to carry a single one of his party members into office.

Yesterday's election results proved to be one of the most unusual in Boys State history. In other years, one party has won the top office and had a minority on the Board of Public Works. This race, however, carried thru to the five judgeships on the Supreme Court.

The 1957 officials will be inaugurated at 4:00 p.m. today in a ceremony in the Ampitheater with Supreme Court Judge Chauncey M. Browning giving the oath. This is to be followed by a formal review.

One of the week's highlights

One of the week's highlights will be the appearance of Gov. Cecil Underwood at tonight's dinner in honor of the state's 20th anniversary. Several past governors are expected to be here.

The spirited election campaign ended last night with the traditional torchlight parage over the Mill grounds. Each party had a band, flares and cheers to mark its progress.

Some of the signs displayed by candidates and parties this year exhibited ingenuity. "Mark your 'X' for Tex" was one of the best slogans veteran counselors could remember. Marvin Bomar's "Bomar Times," a one page "newspaper," plugged his candidacy for a state office.

The Nationalist Party erected the biggest sign in Boys State history on the front of the Dining Hall. Using 82x14" paper, the Nats put 120 sheets together for a mammoth display about 7x14 feet in size.

Last night's assembly program
featured a talk by Don Thompson of
Beckley, a 1954 Boys Stater who is
now a midshipman at the U.S. Naval
Academy in Annapolis. He displayed
a motion picture of life at the
Academy.

Gov.-Elect Kile will apparently have at least a tie in the Senate. The upper house was 13-11 for Federalists with 12 of the 13 counties reporting at 1:30 a.m. The House went to the Nationalists 27-25.
