HIGHLIGHT OF KILE'S ADDRESS TO LEGISLATURE

JACKSON'S MILL, W. VA.

THE ARMY - A CAREER

Governor Kile addressed a Joint Session of the House of Delegates and Senate at 11:00 A.M.

Governor requested power to appoint a Committee to study prospects of securing another cottage for the camp. Suggested that advance literature be sent to each Boys State citizen to aid them in making plans for their week here. He felt that the Boys State Legislature should submit a resolution to establish a preamble to the W.Va. Constitution recognizing the Supreme being. He felt that a Boys State Creed should be adopted and he will submit this Creed to the Legislature for their approval.

Kile proposed a resolution urging the expansion of the Forestry Camp training program of W. Va. He proposed that a request for the Mountaineer Boys State Board of Public Works to appear before a Joint Session of the W.Va. State Legislature be sent to the President of the W.Va. State Senate and the Speaker of the House of Delegates.

Governor Kile proposed that a resolution be drafted to express the thanks of the citizens of Mountaineer Boys State to the sponsoring organizations, Chief Counselor Fugitt, his staff and the American Legion Department of West Virginia, and to our Loving Heavenly Father for the opportunity of experiencing this great citizenship training. He hoped that each citizen's experience will add much to the well being of all citizens in West Virginia.

PARTY AND TALENT NIGHT - FRIDAY

Friday night at Mountaineer Boys State is the traditional talent night assembly program. Competitive stunts will be presented by each cabin and judged by experts. The winner will be announced and appropriate awards will be made. Last year's winner was Marion and prior to that Braxton displayed the best talent. WEST POINT CADET ADDRESSES

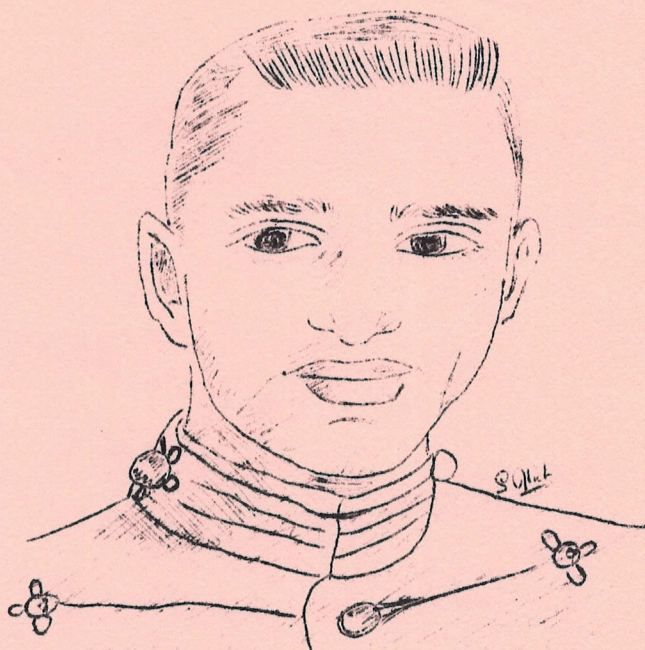
BOYS STATE
