Voters to Decide Changes in State at Election Tonight

Two amendments to the Boys State constitution will be presented to the voters at tonight's general election.

One will bring Boys State in line with the state of West Virginia.

The other will put Boys State in the position of suggesting what is described as a "forward step" which the state should take.

As approved by the Boys State legislature in 1961, the "forward" looking amendment would provide for the creation of a Secretary of Industrial Commerce as a part of the Executive Department of the State. It also provides that the office of Superintendent of Schools shall once again be elective. This would increase the Board of Public Works to eight offices from the present six.

Boys State offices usually follow those of the State of West Virginia in every respect. Just how Staters will react to this proposal to make their offices different from the state will be decided tonight.

The other amendment will forbid elective or appointive officers of the state from being a member of the legislature.

152 STATERS SUCCESSFULLY COMPLETE 1962 BAR EXAMINATION

Robert L. Keller, Braxton, won top honors Monday by posting the highest grade in the annual bar examination.

Second place went to Kanawha's Bob Elliott.

Names of the 150 other new lawyers are posted at GHQ. They have not been ranked according to the grades.

In the 1961 state, 123 lawyers were certified compared with 135 a year earlier. In both years, all Staters taking the exam passed it. Only five failed to get a passing grade this year.

GANDEE, PETERS WIN OVER FIELD OF 19 IN GUBERNATORIAL RACE

The 25th governor of Boys State will be either Phil Peters, Nationalist, or Federalist Wayne Gandee. These two Staters won the nomination of their parties at Monday's primary election.

Peters won over nine other candidates while Gandee defeated eight opponents.

Full returns for all candidates in both parties on a county-by-county basis are on pages 2 and 3 of today's newspaper.

Biggest vote getter in the election was the Federalists Tommy Wooten who picked up 102 votes in winning nomination for the Supreme Court. "Tex" Santini, Nationalist winner for Commissioner of Agriculture led his party with 92.

Tightest race was staged by the Federalists running for Attorney General. Guy Kump won with 40 votes and the four others in the race had 38, 36, 34 and 25 votes.

First returns arrived at GHQ at 10:40 p.m. when Calhoun reported. The last county, Marion, sent in its state totals at 12:30 a.m. to end the tabulation.

After winners were known, both parties sent their workers to GHQ to begin preparations for today's general election. Lights were still burning well after 2 a.m.

RAINY SPELL OF WEATHER MARKS EARLY PART OF 1962 BOYS STATE

Some Boys States are rainy, some are dry. Others have a mixture of weather.

The first two days in 1962 have provided overcast skies and heavy rains. Monday's sports program was completed before the rain began to fall. As on Sunday, there was rain during the evening.

DEFENSE SEMINAR AT ASSEMBLY
 IS ANOTHER "FIRST" FOR '62 STATE

Monday's evening assembly program was a first for any Boys State in the Nation. A team of officers from the Pentagon conducted a defense seminar to answer questions from the audience.

The delegation was headed by Col. John J. Stephens and included Major Judson J. Conner and Capt. Thorne H. Marlow.

If this test operation is considered a success, the program is to be expanded to other Boys State camps.

After the program, Col. Stephens said: "I've been all over the world and I've never seen anything which has impressed me as much as your Boys State program. The enthusiasm of the boys is wonderful and the dedication of the men who serve on the staff indicates that there is a world of good coming from this program."

The program was arranged by Dr. Ben I. Golden, of Elkins.

Monday's assembly program was in marked contrast to Sunday's. No time was needed to assist the camera crews was one factor. Another was the political air and a third was the enthusiasm generated by the newly-formed Boys State band.

1962 PRIMARY BALLOT CONTAINS
 FAMOUS WEST VIRGINIA NAMES

Four names famous in West Virginia politics were on Monday's ballot: Gore, Kump, Holt and McCorkle.

Guy Kump is a grandson of the former West Virginia governor. He ran for Attorney General. Dave McCorkle, running for Secretary of State, is a distant relative of a former governor. Bob Gore and Pete Holt, also on the state ticket, have famous political names but we have not learned of their relationships, if any, to former governors.

HERE'S PART TWO OF STORY
 ON "LIKE FATHER, LIKE SON"

Four 1962 Boys Staters are sons of Fathers who attended Boys State in earlier years. This fact came to light Monday in response to a question in The Mountaineer.

The Fathers of Jim Stuart, Calhoun, and Mervin Gutshall were at the Mill in 1939. Phil Peters of Lewis County reports that his Dad was one of the 1936 Boys Staters. Eric Jurgensen, Calhoun, says his Dad went to Michigan Boys State in 1937.
