## Voters to Decide Changes in State at Election Tonight

Two amendments to the Boys State constitution will be presented to the voters at tonight's general election.

One will bring Boys State in line with the state of West Virgin

The other will put Boys State in the position of suggesting what is described as a "forward step" which the state should take.

As approved by the Boys State legislature in 1961, the "forward" looking amendment would provide for the creation of a Secretary of Industrial Commerce was a part of the Executive Department of the State. It also provides that the office of Superintendent of Schools Court. shall once again be elective. This would increase the Board of Public Works to eight offices from the present six.
