State Superintendent of Schools Charleston, West Virginia 25305

BIOGRAPHICAL DATA

Daniel B. Taylor has been serving as State Superintendent of Schools in West Virginia since July 1, 1970.

He obtained a Bachelor's Degree (B.A.) from the University of Iowa, at Iowa City; a Master's Degree (M.A.) and Doctorate (Ed.D.) from West Virginia University and has engaged in graduate study at the Harvard Graduate School of Education.

Dr. Taylor has been a junior high school teacher in Iowa City, Iowa; a senior high school teacher in Connellsville, Pennsylvania; the Administrative Assistant to the Superintendent of Schools in Plainfield, New Jersey; the Assistant Superintendent of Schools for Instruction in Wood County, West Virginia, before serving for four years as Superintendent of Schools in Wood County.

In addition to serving as State Superintendent of Schools and as Chief Executive Officer of the West Virginia Board of Education which is charged with the responsibility for all elementary, secondary and vocational education in the State, he serves as a member of the (1) West Virginia Board of Public Works, (2) Board of Regents, (3) Educational Broadcasting Authority, (4) Commission on Aging, (5) Commission on Mental Retardation, and (6) Teachers' Retirement Board. He is a member of the Early Childhood Education Task Force of the Education Commission of the States, and is a member of the Board of Directors of the Council of Chief State School Officers.

Dr. Taylor is a veteran of the Korean conflict, having served in the United States Army. He is married to the former Rosemary Snyder, and they are the parents of three children: Eric, Melanie, and Michelle.
