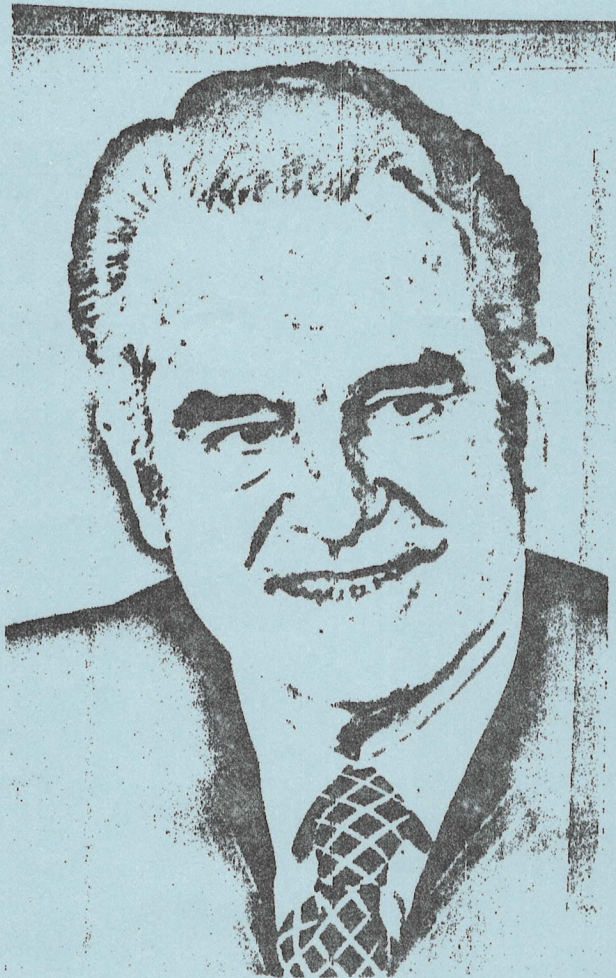
JOHN LARRIE BAILEY

John Larrie Bailey was elected the 20th State Treasurer of West Virginia in 1976 and is now serving in that office. He is from Fairmont, West Virginia, where he resides with his wife, the former Joyce Kennedy, and their three children. Mr. Bailey was born in Weston, Lewis County, the only son of Carrie Gibbon Bailey and the late John W. Bailey. He graduated from Weston High School where he played football and basketball. He served three years in the U. S. Navy and is now active in the Naval Reserve holding the rank of Lt. Commander. After the Navy, he was enrolled in the University of South Carolina where he graduated with an A.B. degree. He also holds a Master's in Political Science and has completed most of his work toward a Doctorate at West Virginia University. He taught two years at Lost Creek High School. Mr. Bailey was the Democratic nominee for Congress in 1964 from the old West Virginia first district. He is a licensed stock broker with the New York Exchange in West Virginia, holds a real estate and insurance license. At one time he had his own public relations office. He was an official with the W. Va. Department of Welfare and was a congressional aide in Washington, D. C. Mr. Bailey is a member of the Marion County Chamber of Commerce, the Elks, the Moose, Phi Kappa Sigma Fraternity, and the Masonic Lodge.

Robert H. Mollohan, (D), of Fairmont, Marion County; born in Grantsville, Sept. 18, 1909, son of Robert P. and Edith Witt Mollohan; attended Glenville College and Shepherd College; married Helen M. Holt of Glenville; father of two sons, one daughter; served as Chief, of Miscellaneous Tax Division and Cashier of the United States Internal Revenue Bureau in West Virginia; District Manager and State Personnel Director, Work Projects Administration; State Director 1940 Census; Superintendent of W. Va. Industrial School for Boys; United States Marshall for the Northern District of W. Va.; Clerk of the United States Senate Committee on the District of Columbia; member of First Baptist Church, Fairmont; member of Elks, Eagles, and Loyal Order of Moose; elected to 83rd and 84th Congresses and reelected to the 91st, 92nd, 93rd and 94th Congress.
