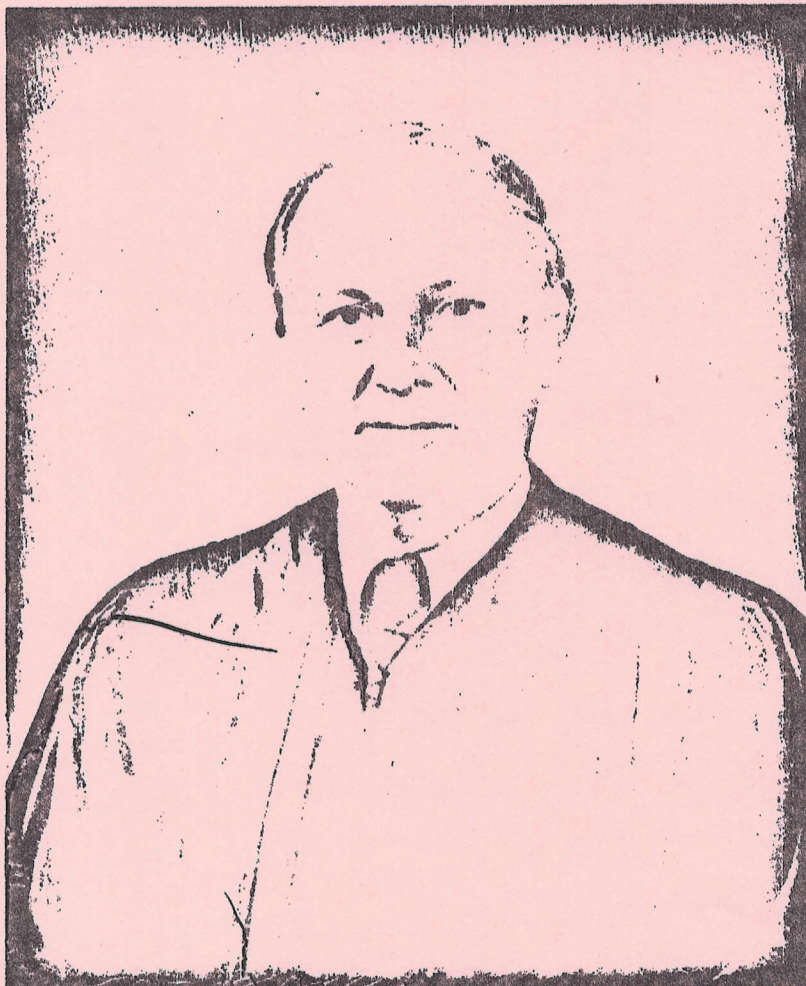

CHIEF JUSTICE OF THE SUPREME COURT OF APPEALS

FRED H. CAPLAN, of Clarksburg, was born in that city on December 3, 1914; son of Henry A. and Hannah Caplan; education received in Clarksburg public schools, West Virginia University (A.B.), the University of Richmond (LL.B.) and Honorary LL.D. University of Richmond, 1971; married November 12, 1941, to Miriam Kessler of Richmond, Virginia; one daughter—Betty Lee; member of B'nai Jacob Synagogue, B'nai B'rith, Harrison County and West Virginia Bar Associations, West Virginia State Bar, V. F. W.; U.S. Army November 17, 1941, to January 13, 1946, two years overseas in South and South Pacific theatres; elected to the House of Delegates from Harrison County in 1948 and reelected in 1950; on August 1, 1953, appointed Assistant Attorney General by Attorney General John Fox; resappointed by Attorney General W. W. Barron and Attorney General C. Donald Robertson. On June 1, 1961, he was appointed to the Public Service Commission by Governor W. W. Barron, for a six-year term, and was named Chairman of the Commission for a one-year term ending May 31, 1962. Awarded Honorary Degree of Doctor of Laws June 7, 1971, by the University of Richmond. On May 18, 1962, he was appointed by Governor Barron to the Supreme Court of Appeals, to serve the interim term created by the vacancy which occurred by reason of the death of Judge Leslie E. Given. He was unanimously nominated by the Democratic Party at its Judicial Convention on August 11, 1962; elected November, 1962, for unexpired term ending December 31, 1965; reelected November 1968, for term of twelve years. President of Supreme Court 1969 and 1971; Chief Justice of the Supreme Court in 1974 and 1977.

Elected to the House of Delegates in 1952, 1954, 1956, 1958, 1960 and 1962; Majority Leader, 55th & 56th Legislatures; elected to the Senate in 1964, 1968 and 1972; Chairman, Committee on the Judiciary, 58th, 59th & 60th Legislatures; Majority Leader, 60th Legislature; elected President of the 61st and 62nd Legislatures. Cochairman, Purchasing Practices and Procedures Commission. Born April 17, 1926, in Kanawha County; son of Kathryn (Slack) and the late W. T. Brotherson. Education, public schools and Washington and Lee University (AB and LLB). Married June 17, 1950, to Ann Jourdan Caskey of Wichita Falls, Texas; three children--Elizabeth Ann, William T., III and Laura Jane. Lawyer, Episcopalian; Mason, Senior Warden. Member, Kappa Alpha, Phi Alpha Delta, American Bar Association. Former investigator, Kanawha County Prosecuting Attorney's Office. Selected Sunday Gazette-Mail's West Virginian of the Year, 1970. U.S. Navy, World War II.

BIOGRAPHICAL DATA

Daniel B. Taylor has been serving as State Superintendent of Schools in West Virginia since July 1, 1970.

He obtained a Bachelor's Degree (B.A.) from the University of Iowa, at Iowa City; a Master's Degree (M.A.) and Doctorate (Ed.D.) from West Virginia University and has engaged in graduate study at the Harvard Graduate School of Education.

Dr. Taylor has been a junior high school teacher in Iowa City, Iowa; a senior high school teacher in Connellsville, Pennsylvania; the Administrative Assistant to the Superintendent of Schools in Plainfield, New Jersey; the Assistant Superintendent of Schools for Instruction in Wood County, West Virginia, before serving for four years as Superintendent of Schools in Wood County.

Since assuming the State Superintendency he has been instrumental in establishing comprehensive programs in early childhood education, school finance reform, vocational education, school construction and renovation, and programs for the handicapped.

In addition to serving as State Superintendent of Schools and as Chief Executive Officer of the West Virginia Board of Education which is charged with the responsibility for all elementary, secondary and vocational education in the State, he serves as a member of the (1) West Virginia Board of Public Works, (2) Board of Regents, (3) Educational Broadcasting Authority, of which he currently serves as Chairman, (4) Commission on Aging, (5) Commission on Mental Retardation, and (6) Teachers' Retirement Board. He currently serves as President of the Council of Chief State School Officers.

Dr. Taylor is a veteran of the Korean conflict, having served in the United States Army. He is married to the former Rosemary Snyder, and they are the parents of three children: Eric, Melanie, and Michelle.
