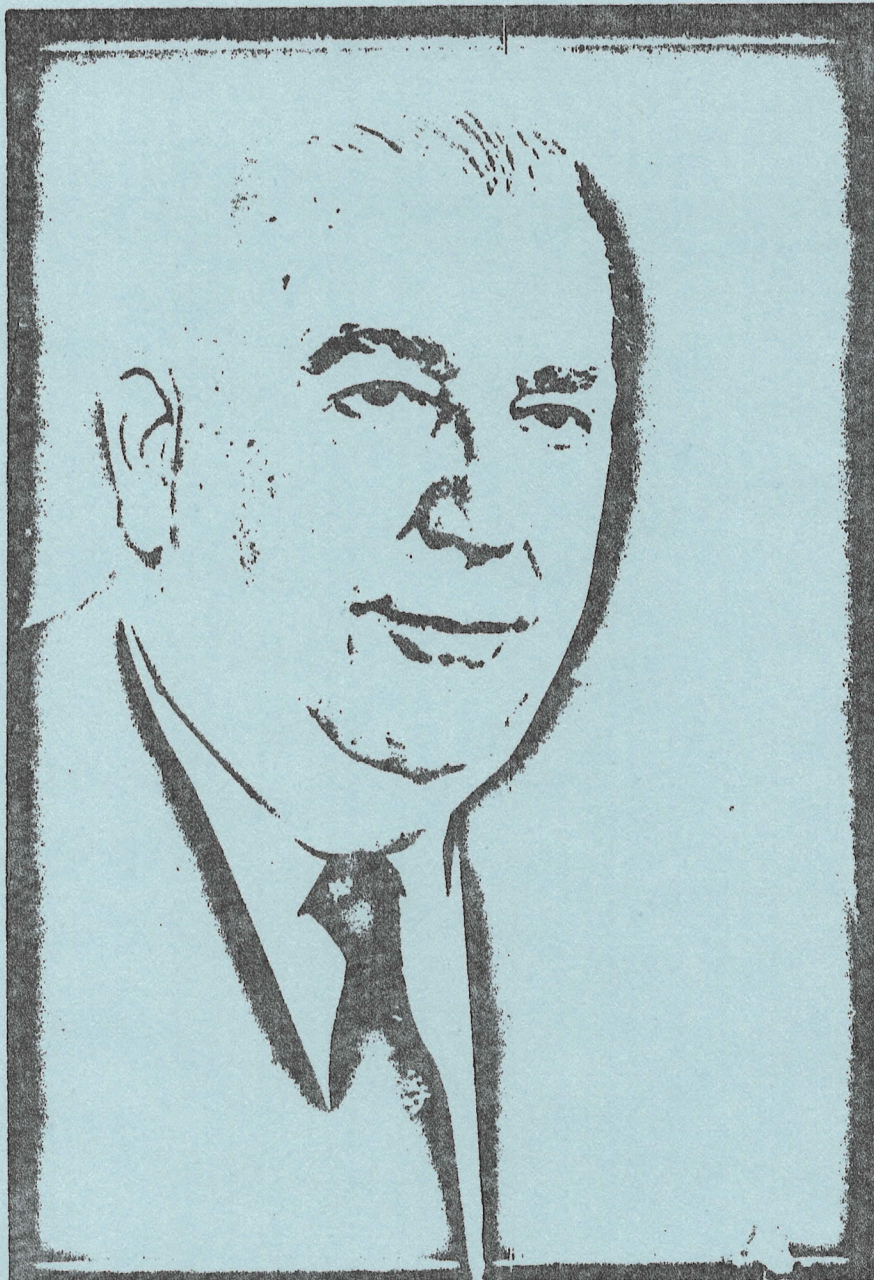

**JENNINGS RANDOLPH, (D)**, of Elkins, Randolph County, was born at Salem, West Virginia, March 8, 1902; son of Ernest and Idell (Bingman) Randolph; graduated from Salem Academy, 1920, and Salem College, magna cum laude, 1924; honorary degrees—doctor of laws, Davis and Elkins College 1939; doctor of letters, Southeastern University, 1940; doctor of aeronautical science, Salem College, 1943; doctor of humanities, West Virginia State College, 1964; doctor of laws, University of Pittsburgh, 1965; doctor of humane letters, Maryville College, 1966; doctor of laws, Alderson-Broadus College, 1966; doctor of laws, West Virginia University, West Virginia Wesleyan College, Milton College and Waynesburg College, all in 1967; doctor of public service, Bethany College, 1970; doctor of laws, Oral Roberts University, 1972; Pikeville College, 1973; Morris Harvey College, 1973; married 1933 to Mary Katherine Babb; two sons, Jennings, Jr., and Frank; member Seventh Day Baptist Church; president West Virginia Intercollegiate Press Association, 1922-23; member editorial staff Clarksburg Daily Telegram, 1924-25; associate editor West Virginia Review Magazine, Charleston, 1925-26; former associate editor Randolph Enterprise-Review, Elkins; head of department of public speaking and journalism, Davis and Elkins College, 1926-32; former university dean; former airline executive and transportation officer; trustee, Salem, and honorary trustee, Davis and Elkins Colleges; member and director of organizations, societies and foundations for education, business, civic, and service programs, including Elkins and West Virginia Chambers of Commerce; Governor's (W. Va.) Committee on Employment of the Handicapped; West Virginia and Randolph County Historical Societies; West Virginia Press Association; elected member 73rd Congress in 1932 and reelected member 74th, 75th, 76th, 77th, 78th, and 79th Congress; elected delegate at large from West Virginia to Democratic National Conventions, 1946, 1952, 1956, 1960 and 1968; elected to United States Senate, November 4, 1968, for unexpired term of Senator M. M. Neely; reelected November 8, 1970, for term ending 1967, reelected 1969, for term ending 1973, reelected 1973 for term ending 1979.



**GLEN B. GAINER, JR., (D)**, of Wood County, born in Parkersburg, July 4, 1927, son of Glen B. Gainer, Sr. and the late Nettie E. Gainer; educated in the public schools of Wood County and graduated from Parkersburg High School in 1945; attended Glenville State College and graduate of Marietta College, Marietta, Ohio, A.B. degree; completed post graduate work from West Virginia University; married to the former Sally Jo Padgett, October 31, 1953; two children, Beth Lyn and Glen E. Gainer, III; served in the United States Navy; high school government teacher and former coach; elected Mayor of the City of Parkersburg, served from 1969 to 1971; listed in International Who's Who and member of several civic and fraternal organizations; elected State Auditor on November 2, 1976 and assumed the duties of State Auditor on January 17, 1977.
