Cechairman, Purchasing Practices and Procedures Commission. Born April 17, 1926, in Kanawha County; son of Kathryn (Slack) and the late W.T. Brotherton. Education, public schools and Washington and Lee University (AB and LLB). Married June 17, 1950, to Ann Jourdan Caskey of Wichita Falls, Texas; three children -- Elizabeth Ann, William T., III, and Laura Jane. Lawyer, Episcopalian; Mason, Senior Warden. - 1. Today the main concern of every Mountaineer citizen is the availability of energy for our homes and our automobiles. We the Nationalist Party propose that the time to use W.Va. coal is now, using W.Va. technology, creating jobs for West Virginians and also creating investment capital for increased W.Va. economic development. In addition, the use of W.Va. coal will reduce the U.S. dependence on the whim of a foreign country.
- 2. Furthermore, to diminish the harshness of our energy crunch, we the Nationalist Party propose the appropriation of funds for a research program at WVU and Marshall University which will concentrate on the development of a synthetic fuel and, further, which eliminates this State's and the United States' dependence on a limited energy source.
- 3. West Virginia's State Parks system is to be enlarged and improved to provide more and better recreation facilities for Mountaineer citizens. We feel this will further save energy by providing recreational facilities close to home. First consideration in State park facilities shall be given to Mountaineer citizens.

- 6. The West Virginia colleges shall be geared to recruit and to enroll West Virginia students, thus providing an incentive for West Virginia citizens to remain in the State and contributing their talents to the development of West Virginia.
