WELCOME TO BOYS' STATE

The 44th Annual American Legion Mountaineer Boys' State was officially underway yesterday afternoon at 1:00 p.m. when the Boys' State Administrator, Robert Stine, began registering the 1981 citizens from throughout West Virginia. Mr. Stine has served Mountaineer Boys' State for 21 years and is presently in his first year as administrator of the Boys' State Program. Mr. Stine was appointed in September of 1980 when Mr. Tommy E. Jones retired as the administrator after 35 years of service to Boys' State. Mr. Stine had the benefit of personal counsel and help from Mr. Jones from September through December until the untimely death of Mr. Jones on December 23, 1980.

Mr. Stine pledges to continue the same high quality program that has been so successful in the past. The keys are organization and getting excellent people to do the various duties that must be done in order to have a successful Boys State Program.

Mr. Stine is employed by the West Virginia Public Service Commission and has been in his present position for 22 years.

AMERICAN LEGION STATE COMMANDER

Department of West Virginia Commander Dana Orndorff spoke to the citizens of Boys' State during the Sunday night assembly. Ir. Orndorff told the citizens about flag day and to think about what they are saying when they give the pledge to the flag. He also encouraged the citizens to participate, get involved and take full advantage of the information being afforded to them this week.

Commander Orndorff congratulated each citizen for being selected because they were the cream of the crop. "My challenge to each of you is, regardless of what life may have in store for you, that you take the knowledge you have gained this week back to your communities and practice good citizenship."

Commander Orndorff has served on the Boys' State Staff for 12 years. He was the Senior Counselor in Panhandle Cottage for 10 years and in Monongalia Cottage for one year. He is serving 15 Commander this year. (See attached biographical.)

Boys' Staters met the incumbent Governor of Mountaineer Boys' State, Mark Zachwieja from Bluefield. Governor Zachwieja graduated this month from Bluefield High School and resided in Randolph County last year while attending Boys' State. He was a member of the Federalist Party. Governor Zachwieja will preside over all functions until the 1981 Governor is inaugurated on Wednesday afternoon.

In April, 1981 he was appointed Director of Emergency Services at St. Johns Medical Center.
