## W E L C O M E T O B O Y S ' S T A T E

The 45th Annual American Legion Mountaineer Boys' State was officially underway yesterday afternoon at 1:00 p.m. when the Boys' State Administrator, Robert Stine, began registering the 1982 citizens from throughout West Virginia. Mr. Stine has served Mountaineer Boys' State for 22 years and is presently in his second year as administrator of the Boys' State Program. Mr. Stine was appointed in September of 1980 when Mr. Tommy E. Jones retired as the administrator after 35 years of service to Boys' State. Mr. Stine had the benefit of personal counsel and help from Mr. Jones from September through December until the untimely death of Mr. Jones on December 23, 1980.

Mr. Stine pledges to continue the same high quality program that has been so successful in the past. The keys are organization and getting excellent people to do the various duties that must be done in order to have a successful Boys State Program.

Mr. Stine is employed by the West Virginia Public Service Commission and has been in his present position for 23 years.

Boys' Staters met the incumbent Governor of Mountaineer Boys' State, Brent Walker from Charleston. Governor Walker graduated this month from George Washington High School and resided in Randolph County last year while attending Boys' State. He was a member of the Federalist Party. Governor Walker will preside over all functions until the 1982 Governor is inaugurated on Wednesday afternoon.

Jackson's Mill was the setting yesterday for a meeting of four Boys' State Governors.

Jim St. Clair, Governor in 1952 and a Boys' State staff member for 20 years, Charles Lucas, Governor in 1954, Mark Zachwieja, Governor in 1980 and a Boys' State Staff member for 2 years, and Brent Walker, the present Boys' State Governor met at Harrison Cottage.

Governor St. Clair is an attorney with Marshall & St. Clair law firm in Huntington. Governor Lucas is in the tire business in Beckley. Governor Zachwieja is a student and a member of the football team at Virginia Tech. Governor Walker has just signed an athletic scholarship for track at the University of North Carolina after running the West Virginia State High School track championships in the 110 meter high hurdles and the 400 metre dash.

The conversation dealt mainly with past and present events at Boys' State, including the possibility of a reunion of Mountaineer Boys' State Governors in the future.

### I. TOMMY E. JONES TROPHY AWARD

4. Organizational ability
5. Creativity

### II. P. E. KERCHEVAL AWARD

To be awarded for the P. E. Kercheval Award, a citizen must be a participant in the activities of Boys' State, be courteous, congenial, have high moral standards, and demonstrate leadership.

## METHOD OF SELECTING SPECIAL AWARDS

Recommendations by the Counselors of each cottage, one per cottage.

The candidate will not necessarily be limited to the recommendations of the counselors.

### III. FRANK TAYLOR, JR. AWARD

This trophy is awarded to the citizen of Mountaineer Boys' State who exhibits the qualities of having an enthusiastic interest in law and of high moral character with honor and respect and integrity for the rights of others. In addition, this young man must be an active participant in the programs of Mountaineer Boys' State. All citizens who have successfully passed the Mountaineer Boys' State Bar Exam will be considered for this award.

### IV. WILLIAM R. FUGITT MEMORIAL TROPHY

The Bill Fugitt Award is the best total score attained by a cottage in the eight categories listed below:

1. City government
2. County government
3. Board of Education
4. Law Examination
5. Circuit Court
6. Inspection
7. Athletics
8. General conduct of all citizens of that cottage during the entire week.
