### PRESIDENT OF WEST VIRGINIA UNIVERSITY SPEAKS TO CITIZENS

The citizens gave a hearty welcome to E. Gordon Gee, President of WVU at the evening assembly. His presence at Boys' State is greatly appreciated by the citizens and Staff.

Dr. Gee was introduced by Oce Smith, Sargent-at-arms, West Virginia Legislature. Smith said that Dr. Gee is the first President of WVU to visit Mountaineer Boys' State for many years.

Dr. Gee delivered a very humorous and interesting speech. He referred to the Pitt football team in many of his jokes and stories. He also spoke on the future of West Virginia. He commended the citizens for having been chosen to attend Boys' State. He had previously attended Boys' State in the State of Utah in 1959, and was elected Governor of the Utah Boys' State. He emphasized the importance of the week at Boys' State as being possibly a changing point in their lives.
