To be awarded for the P.E. Kercheval Award, a citizen must be a participant in the activities of Boys' State, be courteous, congenial, have high moral standards, and demonstrate leadership.

III. FRANK TAYLOR, JR. AWARD

This trophy is awarded to the citizen of Mountaineer Boys' State who exhibits the qualities of having an enthusiastic interest in law and of high moral character with honor and respect and integrity for the rights of others. In addition, this young man must be an active participant in the programs of Mountaineer Boys' State. All citizens who have successfully passed the Mountaineer Boys' State Bar Exam will be considered for this award.

IV. WILLIAM R. FUGITT MEMORIAL TROPHY

The Bill Fugitt Award is the best total score attained by a cottage in the eight categories listed below:

- 1. City government
- 2. County government
- 3. Board of Education
- 4. Law Examination
- 5. Circuit Court
- 6. Inspection
- 7. Athletics
- 8. General conduct of all citizens of that cottage during the entire week.


He is presently living in Charleston, West Virginia. We would like to thank Attorney General Brown for being a part of the 48th Annual Mountaineer Boys' State.
