#### STATE AUDITOR SPEAKS TO CITIZENS:

State Auditor, Glen B. Gainer, spoke to the Citizens at the noon meal on Friday, June 17, 1988. He received a warm welcome by the Citizens.

GLEN B. GAINER, JR. (D) of Wood County, born in Parkersburg, July 4, 1927, son of Glen B. Gainer, Sr. and the late Nettle E. Gainer; educated in the public schools of Wood County and graduated from Parkersburg High School in 1945; attended Glenville State College and is a graduate of Marietta College, Marietta, Ohio, A.B. degree; completed post graduate work from West Virginia University; married to the former Sally Jo Pedgett, October 31, 1955; two children, Beth Gainer Criss and Glen B. Gainer III; served in the United States Navy; high school government teacher and former coach; elected Mayor of the City of Parkersburg, served from 1969 to 1971; listed in International Who's Who and member of seversi civic and fraternal organizations; elected State Auditor on November 2, 1978 and assumed the dutter of State Auditor on January 17, 1977; reelected in 1980 and 1984.



#### ATTORNEY GENERAL SPEAKS TO CITIZENS:

Charlie Brown, Attorney General of West Virginia, spoke to the Citizens at the evening meal. He has attended Boys' State since his election in 1984. CHARLIE BROWN (D) of Charleston, Born June 6, 1950, in Mansfield, Ohio; son of Dr. Charles G and Emily Campbell Brown; one child, Tara; Episcopalian; Phi Beta Kappa graduate of Denison University and graduate of Vale Law School; former high scool teacher and Eagle Scout; second youngest State Attorney General in U.S.; served as staff attorney for Federal Trade Commission; served as Deputy Attorney General, 1978-82; served as first director of the Attorney General's Amitrust Division; practiced law in Charleston from 1982-84; elected Attorney General in 1984 and took office January 14, 1985.









# VS. MONROE COUNTY COMMISSION

This case's decision ruled that Calhoun County has no right or privilege to bill citizens of Boys' State or anyone else, for that matter, for the use of the tennis or basketball courts located behind their cottage. Furthermore, all cotages, past, present, or future, being billed for use of said courts will be free from responsibility of this bill and reimbursed if necessary. Calhoun County citizens, while still in possession of the right to use the courts, will no longer be permitted to post bills concerning use of said courts.

This decision was made on the grounds that nowhere in the Boys' State Manual of Government is there a law that gives possession of said courts to Calhoun County. Also, a signed affidavit from an administrator granting possession of a recreational area is insignificant in that there is no law that states

its significance in the Manual of Government.
