It will be the responsibility of the athletic representative of each county to insure that teams are fielded in accordance with the below schedule. It is of the utmost importance that the teams report to the correct area at the prescribed time. In the event a scheduled game is not played the Athletic Director will determine if the game shall be classified as a cancellation or a forfeiture on the part of one team. The final team standing will be determined on a point system; all scheduled games being of equal value, regardless of sport. RICHARD NEELY

RICHARD NEELY, born August 2, 1941, the son of John C. and Elinore Neely of Marion County, West Virginia; grandson of West Virginia's twenty-first governor. Educated at Dartmouth College, A. B. in Economics, and the Yale Law School, LL.B., 1967. Served as Captain, United States Army Artillery; awarded Bronze Star from the Vietnam conflict. Elected to the West Virginia Legislature from Marion County 1970; elected West Virginia Supreme Court of Appeals 1972.

The Citizens of MBS were honored on Sunday Evening, June 11, 1989, by the presence of Justice Richard Neely of the West Virginia Court of Appeals.

It is especially appropriate that the Fifty-Second Mountaineer Boys' State open our official activities by a Judicial visit with one of West Virginia and America's most honored and prestigious public figures. A possessor of one of our country's keenest, sharpest, and most brilliant minds, this learned jurist is a guest lecturer at many colleges and universities throughout our higher educational heirarchy. He also is a prolific writer with many books and numerous professional articles to his credit.

Justice Neely is a West Virginian by birth, first seeing the light of day as a Marion countian, but he is also a West Virginian by choice, having had many opportunities presented to him in other states. We are pleased that he saw fit to remain with us.

Justice Neely has benefited from a long line of prominent and industrious relatives, one in particular, his Grandfather, being the Honorable Matthew Mansfield Neely, the twenty-fifth governor of West Virginia, and a member of the United States Congress for many years.

We are very pleased that Justice Neely has once again given of his time to the program of Mountaineer Boys' State.
