

BAILEY SPEAKS TO CITIZENS





James was born with cerebral palsy. He said that this limits him somewhat; however, he can set a goal and eventually achieve it. We all need to learn a lesson from James. He has demonstrated his ability to rise above his disability throughout his life. In high school, James was a member of the National Honor Society and served as parlimentarian for Student Council. Currently, James is a member of EMOCLEW, a social club for people with physical disabilities. If you will notice the name, it is WELCOME spelled backwards. He also attends Roney's Point Presbyterian Church.

James is pictured here with his assistant Mark Zachweija. Mark and Brent Walker are two of James' best friends. Of them James has said, "They are most helpful to me in many ways."


