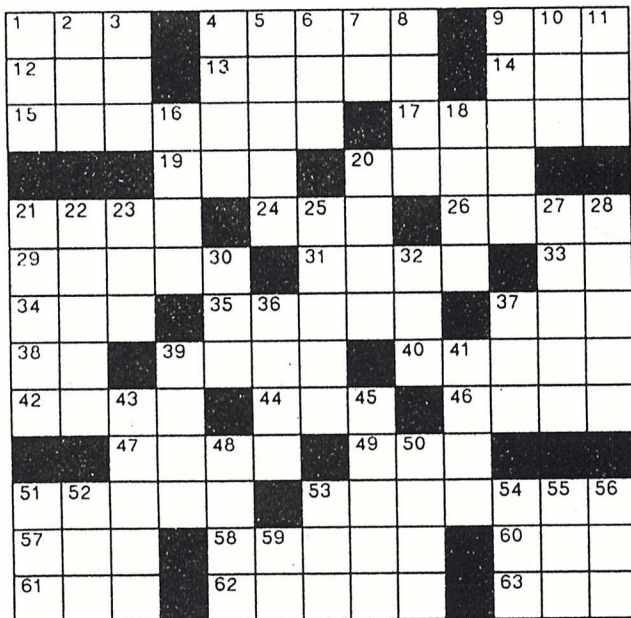

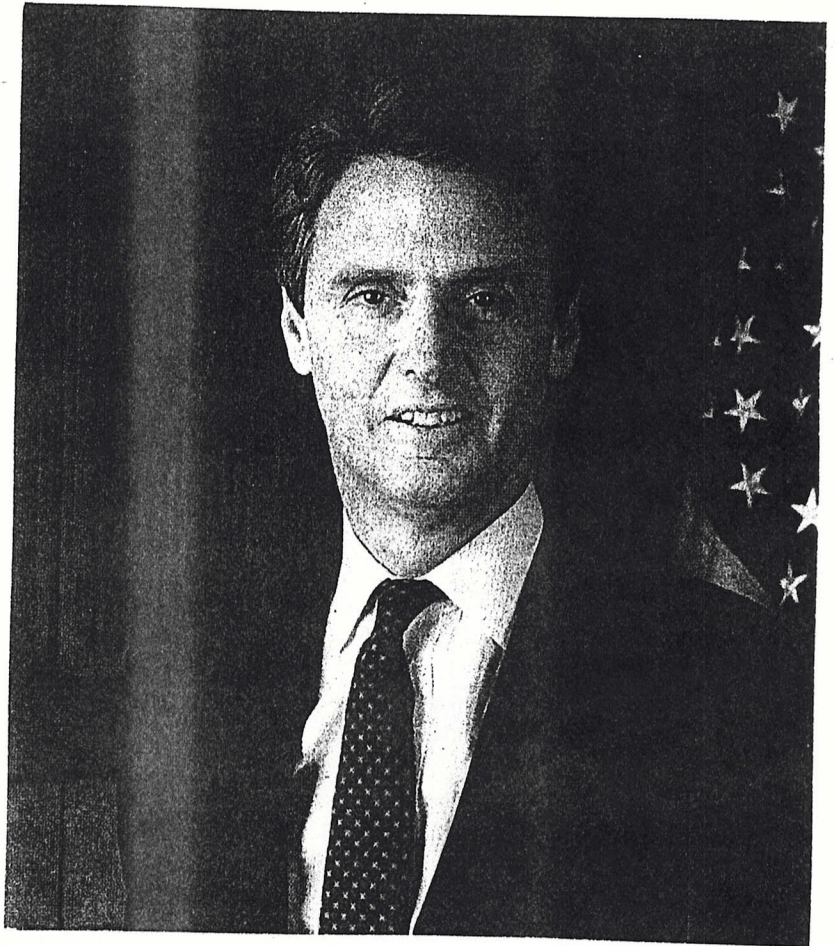
GOVERNOR CAPERTON SPEAKS TO CITIZENS AT ASSEMBLY HALL

The citizens of the 53rd Mountaineer Boys' State met with Governor Caperton in the Assembly Hall. He was given a warm reception from the citizens.

In addressing the citizens, the Governor centered on three majors points: dreams, goals, and being dedicated to the completion of those goals.

Governor Caperton was in no hurry to leave. He visited with some of the citizens and staff. You are welcome to visit us at Boys' State, Governor Caperton. Thank you for taking time from your busy schedule to share some time with the citizens.

GASTON CAPERTON (D) of Charleston, Kanawha County; West Virginia's 31st Governor. Prior to election in 1988 had neither sought nor held political office, career to that point having been devoted to building a small West Virginia business into one of nation's 20 largest insurance brokerage firms. The McDonough Caperton Insurance Group grew from a dozen employees at its Charleston base when Caperton became company president in 1976, to more than 500 employees in five West Virginia communities and eight other states. Won Democratic gubernatorial nomination in a seven-man primary, finishing 10 percentage points ahead of second-place candidate. Captured 59 percent of general election vote. Born February 21, 1940. Attended Kanawha County public schools and graduated from Episcopal High School in Alexandria, Virginia. Earned bachelor's degree in business from the University of North Carolina and holds honorary degrees from Marshall University and Bethany College. Governor Caperton is the father of two sons: Gat, completing his studies at Davidson College and John, a student at Brown University.

R.A. THOM ADDRESSES CITIZENS AT EVENING ASSEMBLY

Mr. R.A. Thom, a member of the 1st Board of Directors of Mountaineer Boys' State, spoke to the citizens at the evening assembly. Mr. Thom spent the day at Jackson's Mill. He visited among friends on the Staff and Citizens.

He related to the citizens that he and Dr. Kercheval were the only two living organizers of Mountaineer Boys' State. The first state to have a Boys' State was Illinois, in 1935.

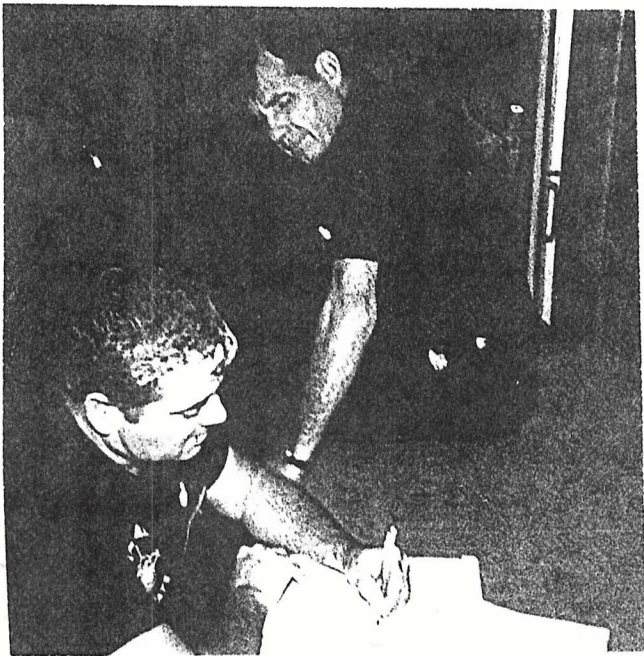
SOMETHING TO REMEMBER:
