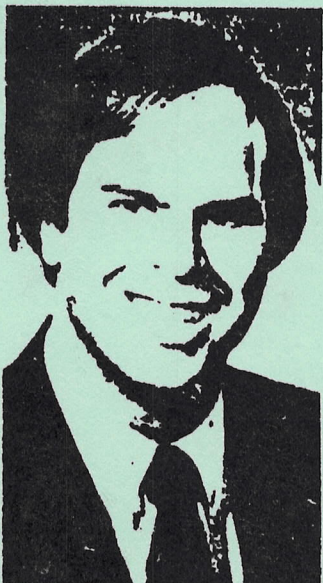

#### WVU REPRESENTATIVE AT MBS

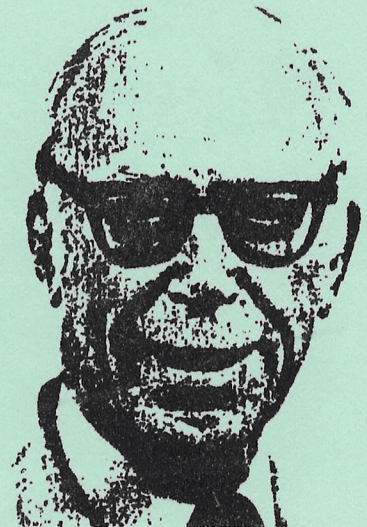
Shelley Poe, Director of Sports Information at WVU, introduced Lorenzo Styles at the noon meal on June 10, 1991.

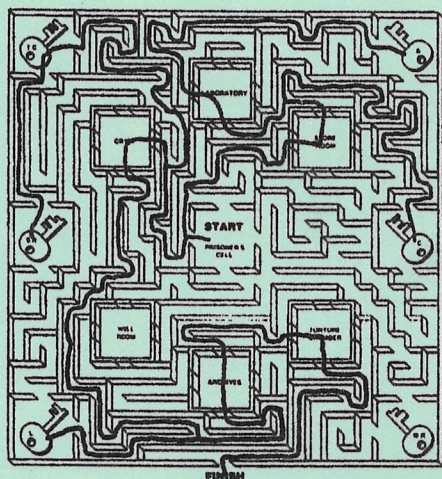

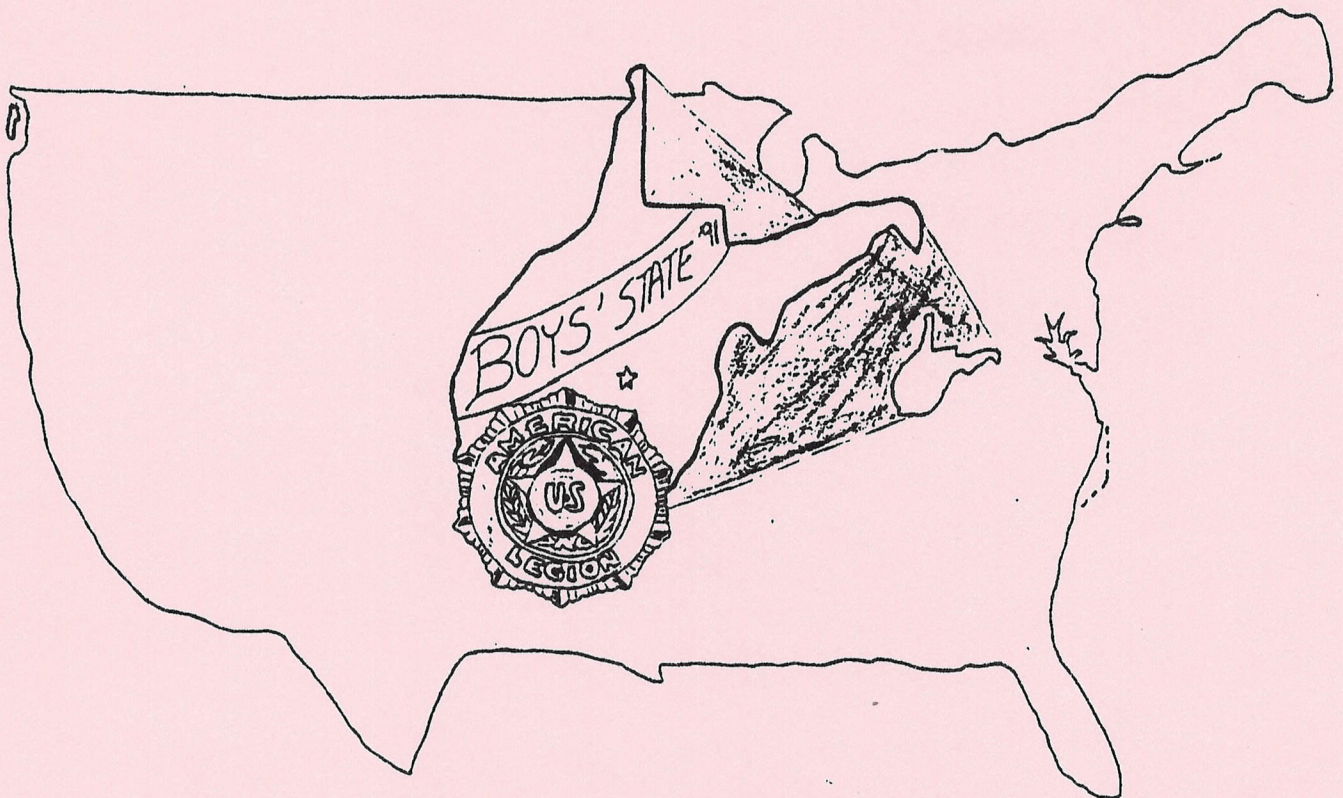

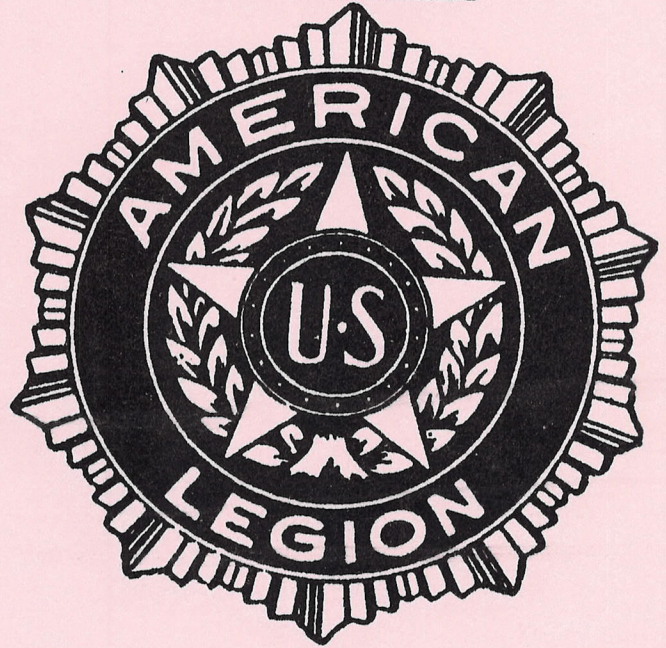
