FAREWELL ADDRESS GOVERNOR JOSEPH LIMER JUNE 12, 1991

ONE YEAR AGO AT THIS TIME, I UNDERTOOK THE CHALLENGE OF BEING GOVERNOR OF THE 1990 BOYS' STATE. I HAD MIXED EMOTIONS AT THAT TIME, FOR I FELT FEAR AND NERVOUSNESS ALONG WITH HAPPINESS AND EXCITEMENT. I WAS HAPPY AND EXCITED BECAUSE I HAD BEEN ELECTED TO AN OFFICE OF GREAT PRESTIGE AND HONOR. YET, I WAS AFRAID AND NERVOUS BECAUSE I WASN'T SURE OF WHAT TO DO, HOW TO ACT, AND MOST IMPORTANTLY, WHETHER I WAS GOOD ENOUGH AND CAPABLE ENOUGH TO BE GOVERNOR.

ONE YEAR LATER, I TELL YOU NOW, THAT ALL OF YOU STANDING BEFORE ME ARE CAPABLE OF BECOMING THE GOVERNOR OF WEST VIRGINIA, OR ANY STATE FOR THAT MATTER, IN THE FUTURE. BEING A COUNSELOR, I CAN SEE THE SAME THING YOUR SPONSORS SAW IN YOU: AND THAT'S LEADERSHIP, THE WILLINGNESS TO LEARN, AND ABOVE ALL, A RESPECT AND LOVE FOR YOUR COUNTRY IF I MAY IMPART TO ALL OF YOU A BIT OF ADVISE: 1) FOLLOW YOUR HEART AND NEVER THINK THAT YOU CAN'T ACCOMPLISH ANYTHING. LAST YEAR, I MET AND TALKED WITH MANY OF MY PEERS WHO DIDN'T RUN FOR STATE OFFICE AND THEY SAID THEY DIDN'T RUN BECAUSE THEY WERE AFRAID OF FAILURE. I MUST TELL YOU, THAT REFLECTING ON LAST CHANCES IS SO MUCH MORE PAINFUL THAN REFLECTING ON A LOSS FOR THERE WILL ALWAYS BE A VOID AND A "WHAT IF I HAD DONE THIS" WITHIN YOU. THEREFORE, I TELL YOU 2) TO MAKE THE MOST OUT OF OPPORTUNITIES, SEIZE THE DAY, "SQUEEZE THE CHARMIN" AS OUR ATTORNEY GENERAL PUT IT, AND WHILE YOU'RE DOING THAT, GO INTO EVERYTHING WITH A POSITVE ATTITUDE. IF YOU HAVE NO CONFIDENCE IN YOURSELF, THEN HOW WILL OTHERS PUT CONFIDENCE IN YOU? DON'T BE AFRAID OF FAILURE BUT BE SURE OF SUCCESS. EXPECTING TO FAIL WILL BE FAILING ALL EXPECTATIONS. ALSO, BE SURE TO HONOR GOD AND COUNTRY. THANK GOD FOR BEING WHERE YOU ARE TODAY AND BE GLAD YOU ARE IN A COUNTRY OF FREEDOM AND DEMOCRACY. MANY PEOPLE HAVE DIED FOR OUR COUNTRY AND FOR THAT, THE UNITED STATES DESERVES AND COMMANDS YOUR RESPECT. MANY TIMES WE HAVE TAKEN THIS GREAT NATION OF OURS FOR GRANTED AND I HOPE THAT ABOVE ALL YOU'VE LEARNED HERE— ABOVE ALL THE CLASSES, THE LECTURES, AND THE MARCHING YOU'VE GOTTEN HERE— YOU'VE LEARNED TO REPECT, LOVE, AND HAVE PRIDE FOR YOUR COUNTRY.
