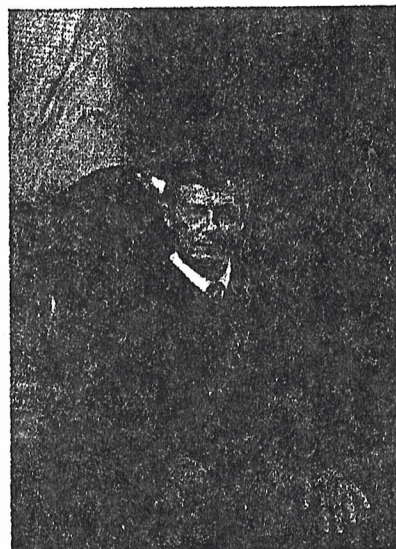

CHIEF JUSTICE SPEAKS TO CITIZENS

Chief Justice of the West Virginia Supreme Court of Appeals, Thomas McHugh, spoke to the Citizens of Boys' State at the evening assembly.

He said that he came here to honor future leaders of the state. Everyone should be proud to be a west Virginian.

THOMAS E. McHUGH was elected to the Supreme Court of Appeals in 1980 and assumed his duties January 1, 1981. Chief Justice, 1984, 1988. He was born in Charleston, March 26, 1936. Justice McHugh is a graduate of West Virginia University, A.B. Political Science, 1958 and served as 1st Lt. U.S. Army 1958-61, Infantry and Adjutant General Corps. Received law degree from West Virginia University College of Law, 1964; member of Order of Coif, legal honorary. In law school was associate editor of the West Virginia Law Review. He served as law clerk to Judge Harlan Calhoun, West Virginia Supreme Court of Appeals, 1966-68. President, West Virginia Judicial Association, 1981-82. He was elected Judge of the Circuit Court of Kanawha County in 1974 and reelected in 1976; chosen by other judges in Circuit Court to serve as chief judge 1974-80. Wife, Judith; four children, Karen, Cindy, James and John.

## SECRETARY OF STATE SPEAKS AT NOON MEAL TODAY

Secretary of State, Ken Hechler, spoke to the Citizens of MBS at the afternoon meal on Monday. Hechler began his presentation by taking an informal poll of MBS citizens as to who was going to win, the Chicago bulls/Phoenix Suns basketball game. The poll resulted in a tie and Hechler commented that he should bet a dollar on each team.

Hechler discussed an Excess Acreage Tax (EAT) proposal that would bring additional revenue to the state to be used for education, health care, and highway projects. Hechler encouraged the citizens to return to their communities and support the EAT.

Hechler also voiced support for spending limitations or emphasized that the power of government could be restored to the people of WV if the concepts of Initiative, referendum and recall were adopted.

Hechler conducted a question and answer session and ended his presentation by explaining how he became a speech writer for President Truman.

Thank you, Secretary of State Hechler, for taking the time to be with us at MBS.

KEN HECHLER (D) of Huntington, born September 20, 1914; single; AB Swarthmore College, 1935; MA Columbia University, 1940; Instructor in Government, Columbia and Barnard Colleges, 1937-41; Research Assistant, Judge Samuel I. Rosenman and President Franklin D. Roosevelt in editing and annotation of *The Public Papers and Addresses of Franklin D. Roosevelt*; Personnel Officer, Office for Emergency Management, Washington, D.C., 1941; Administrative Analyst, U.S. Bureau of Budget, 1942 and 1946; U.S. Army, 1942-46; Graduate, Armored Force Officer Candidate School; commissioned 2nd Lieutenant, 1943; European Theatre of Operations as Combat Historian and promoted to Major, 1944-45; Awarded Bronze Star and five battle stars, Normandy to the Elbe; military expert on 5-man War Department Mission to interrogate Hermann Goering, Joachim von Ribbentrop and other Nazi military leaders, 1945; Assistant Professor of Politics, Princeton University, 1947-49; Research Director and Special Assistant to President Harry S. Truman, 1949-53; Associate Director, The American Political Science Association, Washington, D.C., 1953-55; Research Director, presidential campaign Adlai Stevenson, 1956-57; Associate Professor, Political Science, Marshall University, 1957; Member, U.S. House of Representatives, 1959-77; Science Consultant, U.S. House of Representatives Committee on Science and Technology, 1978-80; Adjunct Professor, Political Science, Marshall University, 1982-84; Member, Board of Directors, West Virginia Humanities Foundation, 1981-84; Delegate to Democratic National Conventions 1964, 1968, 1972, 1980, 1984; Author of several books and papers, including *The Bridge at Remagen*; elected Secretary of State in 1984; reelected in 1988.

Born March 2, 1934, in Weston. Education: University of South Carolina (BA); West Virginia University (MA), political science. Married to the former Joyce Kennedy; three children: John, 23, a graduate of Yale University; David, 20, a Junior at George Washington University; and Anne, 17, a Senior at Fairmont High School. Former Professor, Fairmont State. Member, Phi Kappa Sigma.



### WHO IS RANDY KOCSIS???

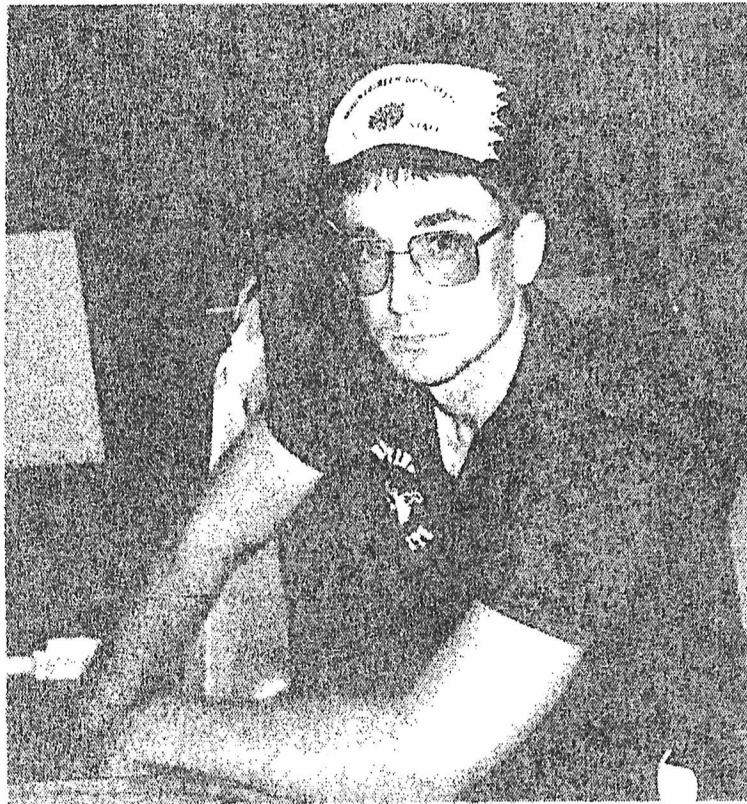

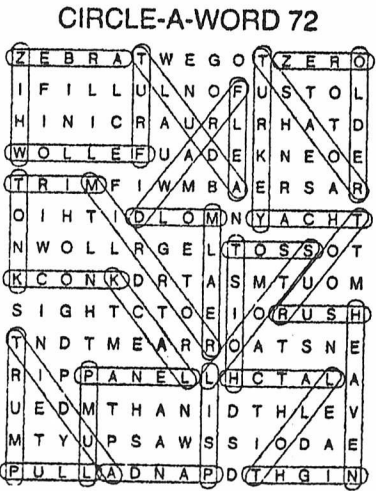
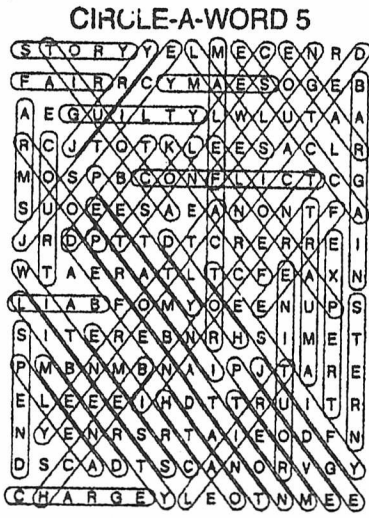

## PRESIDENT ABRAHAM LINCOLN MAKES APPEARANCE AT MBS

On Monday, June 7, 1993, an excellent portrayal of Abraham Lincoln was presented to the citizens at the evening assembly. The portrayal was presented by James Dague, and the audience was spellbound at James' reading of the Gettysburg Address. James presented the Gettysburg Address and the Great Moments with Mr. Lincoln to the citizens of MBS. The hat he wears in his portrayal of Lincoln was given to him 6 years ago by A. James Manchin when Mr. Manchin visited Boys' State and spoke to the citizens.

James lives in Tridelfphia with his parents, Edward and Patty Dague. He graduated from Wheeling Park High School in 1988. He was a citizen of MBS in 1987 and returned for two consecutive years as a junior counselor in Panhandle Cottage where he was a citizen in 1987. He now serves on the headquarters staff.

He attends West Virginia Northern Community College in Wheeling where he is majoring in Liberal Arts. He hopes to pursue an A.B. degree in Political Science or Education. James portrays Lincoln in talent and variety shows, to 4-H and other civic groups, and to schools in various areas of the state. He also presented his portrayal of Lincoln on February 12, 1992 to the West Virginia State Senate in Charleston. He was accompanied by the 1991 Boys' State Senate.

His comments about Boys' State: "I consider Boys' State to be one of the best programs I have had the opportunity to participate in because it permits the citizens to elect their peers to public office and to meet their elected officials."

James was born with cerebral palsy. He said that this limits him somewhat; however, he can set a goal and eventually achieve it. We all need to learn a lesson from James. He has demonstrated his ability to rise above his disability throughout his life. In high school, he was a member of the National Honor Society and served as parliamentarian for Student Council. Currently, James is a member of EMOCLEW, a social club for people with physical disabilities. If you will notice the name, it is WELCOME spelled backwards. He also attends Roney's Point Presbyterian Church.

James has one younger brother, Jerry, who is an EMT and a biology major at Fairmont State College. James just finished a two year course at West Virginia Northern Community College and will continue his education this fall at West Liberty State College.

We wish James well and look forward to his returning to Boys' State each year to help with the program. He has been a real asset to us here at Jackson's Mill.

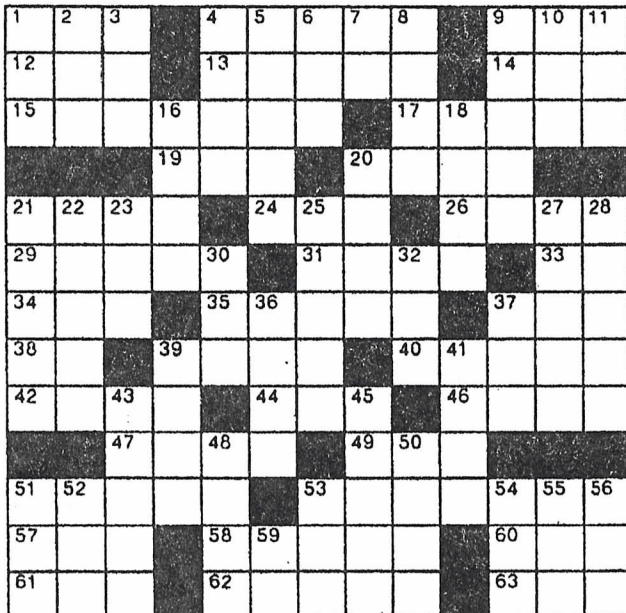

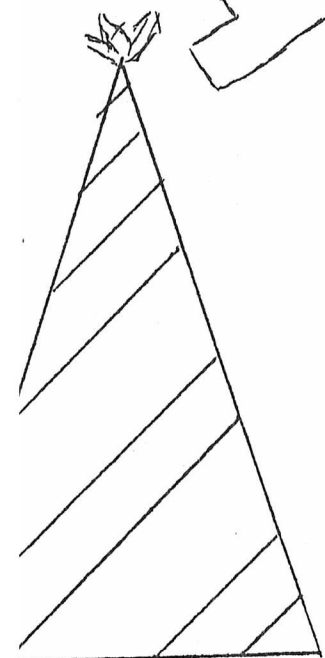

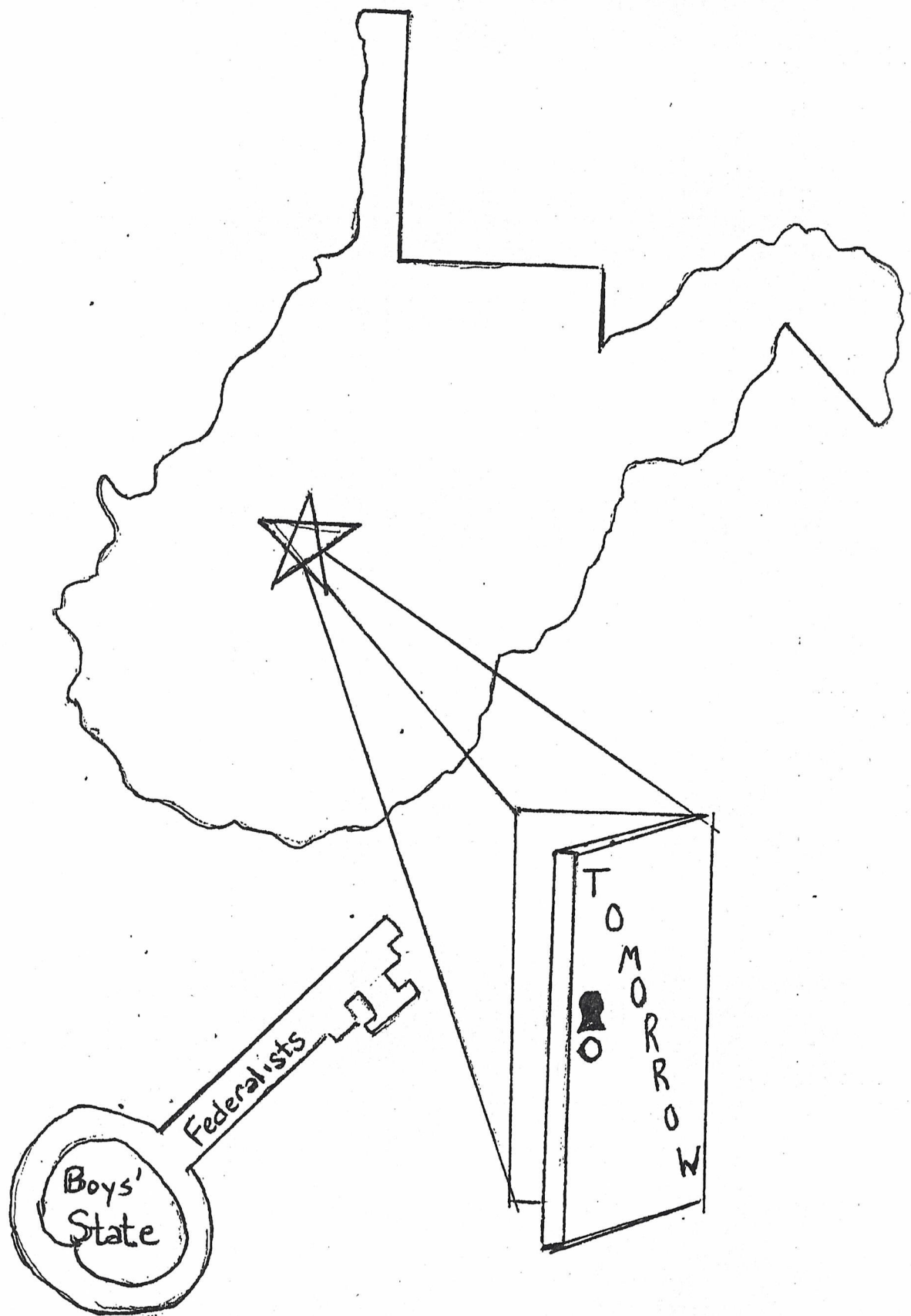
