

Dr. Robert Dillman, President of Fairmont State College, spoke to the Citizens of Boys' State during the evening meal on Tuesday, June 13, 1995.

Dr. Dillman is a native of Brooklyn, New York. He began teaching as a professional geologist. He furthered his education at Penn State and Clark University. He is now serving as president of the college for the seventh year. Fairmont College is the state's largest college, apart from the two state universities.

Dr. Dillman has been a guest of Boys' State for several years. He reminded us that West Virginia is now a part of a global economy. Having just returned from spending a great deal of time in Russia and China he emphasized that young people in those countries would give anything and everything to be availed the opportunity to spend time at something like Boys' State:
