TIME SCHEDULE TO BE ANNOUNCED DAILY AMERICAN LEGION MOUNTAINEER BOYS' STATE ATHLETIC PROGRAM GENERAL RULES

It will be the responsibility of the athletic representative of each county to insure that teams are fielded in accordance with the above schedule. It is of the utmost importance that the teams report to the correct area at the prescribed time. In the event a scheduled game is not played, the Athletic Director will determine if the game shall be classified as a cancellation or a forfeiture on the part of one team. The final team standing will be determined on a point system; all scheduled games being of equal value, regardless of sport. It will be necessary for the counselors to serve as referees and umpires where needed. RAIN OUTS OR POSTPONED GAMES WILL NOT BE MADE UP!

Men...of To..mor..row, a group of all American boys.

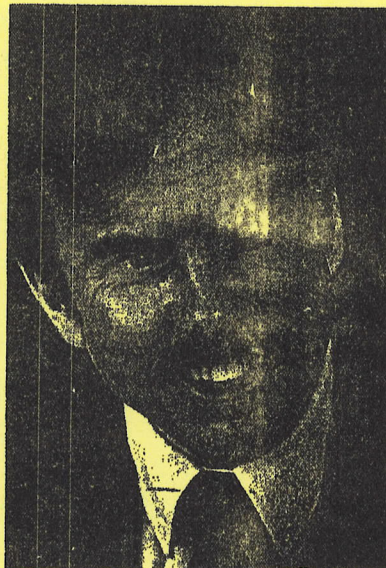
LEARNING TODAY . . . LEADING TOMORROW

Congressman Bob Wise spoke to the citizens of Mountaineer Boys' State at the evening assembly. Congressman Wise encouraged the citizens to get involved in the campaign process and gave suggestions for campaigning. These suggestions were:

1. start right away.
2. build alliances and coalitions
3. bring people together - don't push them away.

He also stated, "After you're elected, you aren't a Democrat or Republican, but you work for the people."

BOB WISE (D) of Clendenin, Kanawha County; born January 6, 1948, in Washington, D.C. Education: Duke University; Tulane University College of Law, Attorney. Elected to the State Senate in 1980 from the 17th Senatorial District. Elected to the 98th Congress in 1982, the 99th Congress in 1984, the 100th Congress in 1986, the 101st Congress in 1988, the 102nd Congress in 1990, the 103rd Congress in 1992 and the 104th Congress in 1994. He has represented West Virginia's Second Congressional District since the election of 1992. His wife, Sandy, is a counsel to the U. S. House Ways and Means Committee, a position she held when he arrived in Washington in 1983. Two children: Robert Whitten Wise and Alexandra Stewart Wise.

Boys' Staters are sponsored by civic clubs, lodges, school and boosters clubs, the American Legion and other service organizations, and business firms. All citizens of Boys' State are selected by the High School Principal or the local American Legion Post officials. In addition, it is required that each boy shall be a member of the current Junior Class of a Senior High School, in the upper quartile of his class, and willing to remain the entire week at Boys' State.

The West Virginia Department of the American Legion pays for the administrative cost and selects counselors.

American Legion Boys Nation Program Celebrates 50th Anniversary in 1996

Each American Legion Boys State selects two outstanding graduates to represent it at American Legion Boys Nation. This program is a continuation of the Boys State experience and involves the practical study of the structure and function of the federal government.

Boys Nation is held each summer in the Washington, D.C. area. It was organized in 1946 as the Boys Forum of National Government and was administered by the Legion's National Americanism Commission. In 1949, action by the Legion's National Convention changed the name of the program to American Legion Boys Nation.

At Boys Nation, each delegate represents his Boys State as a Senator and participates in party conventions and senate sessions. The youthful Senators caucus at the beginning of the session, organize into committees and conduct hearings on bills submitted for their consideration. They are instructed on the proper method of handling bills and resolutions according to the rules of the United States Senate.

Presenters and lecturers at Boys Nation include members of Congress, federal agency officials, organization and lay leaders of national distinction.

During a visit to Capitol Hill, Boys Nation Senators meet and converse with elected Representatives and Senators from their home states. The boys also visit Fort McHenry and other historic sites in and near Baltimore, Maryland, and participate in a very solemn and dignified wreath-laying ceremony at the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier in Arlington National Cemetery. Other visitations include the FBI, Department of State, the Lincoln, Vietnam and Korean Memorials.

The program has an excellent reputation with federal officials as evidenced by the almost annual audience with the President of the United States. President Clinton, a 1963 alumni of Boys Nation, has spent a considerable amount of time with the boys during the first three years of his administration. Boys Nation was a regular invitee to the White House during the Reagan and Bush administrations.

In addition, this young man must be an active participant in the programs of Mountaineer Boys' State. All citizens who have successfully passed the Mountaineer Boys' State Bar Exam will be considered for this award.

IV. WILLIAM R. FUGITT MEMORIAL TROPHY

The Bill Fugitt Award is the best total score attained by a cottage in the eight categories listed below:

1. City government
2. County government
3. Board of Education
4. Law Examination
5. Circuit Court
6. Inspection
7. Athletics
8. General conduct of all citizens of that cottage during the entire week....

V. DR. JOHN T. DOMBROSKY MEMORIAL AWARD
