The would-be assassin, Jason Jones, is currently in custody in Webster County, awaiting a hearing.

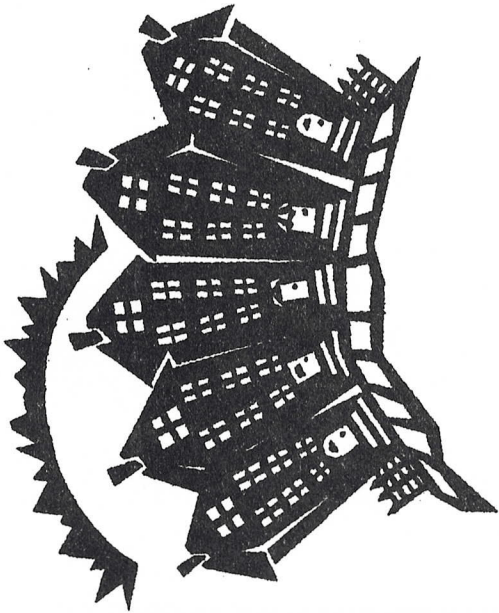
Mayor Barr successfully delivered the county and city packets without further incident.

Walter says that Boys' State is the best program in the United States for young men to learn about state, county, and city government. The facilities at Jackson's Mill are super for this program.

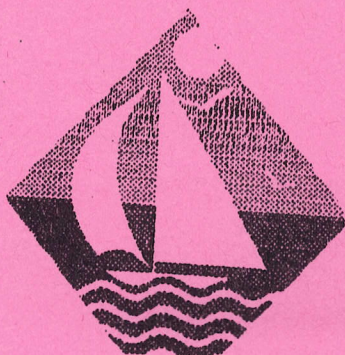

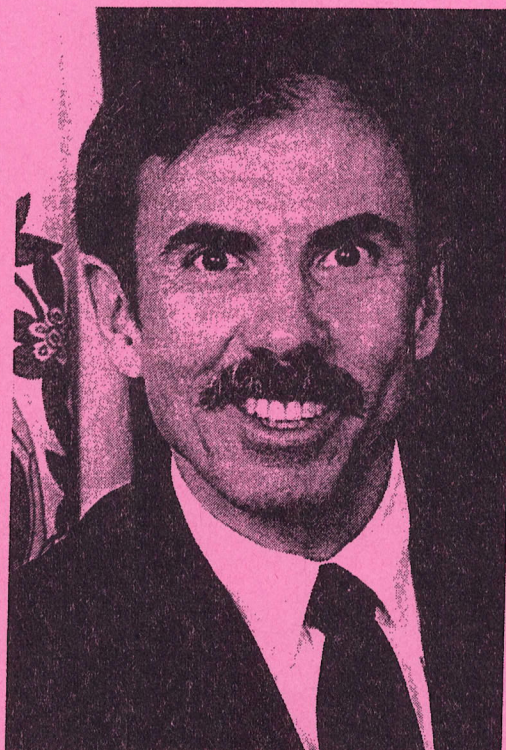


HEADQUARTERS STAFF 1998

Committees: Rules, Finance, Education (Chair), Joint Committee on Government and Finance, Forest Management Review Commission, Legislative Oversight Commission on Education Accountability (House Chair). Majority Whip, 71st Legislature; Speaker Pro Tempore, 72nd Legislature. Born December 1, 1946; son of Mr. and Mrs. A. J. Mezzatesta. Education: Shepherd College (BS); Frostburg State (MEd); Potomac State College; West Virginia University; Marshall University. Married May 29, 1971, to Mary Helen Gibbs; son: Jeffrey L. Educator; Tree Farm Operator. Methodist. Member, Hampshire County Farm Bureau; LOOM; Sons of American Legion.

BOB WISE (D) of Clendenin, Kanawha County; born January 6, 1948, in Washington, D.C. Education: Duke University; Tulane University College of Law. Attorney. Elected to the State Senate in 1980 from the 17th Senatorial District. JUSTICE OF THE SUPREME COURT

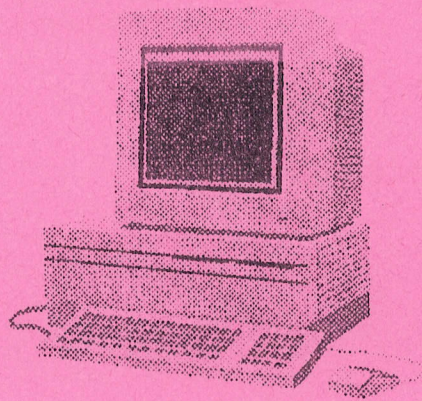
