

William F. "Bill" Johnson was born in Charleston, West Virginia, December 30, 1944 son of the late Emma Laing Sullivan of Lewisburg, West Virginia. He received his education in Lewisburg public schools and Greenbrier Military school.


Bill is a Vietnam veteran having served with the Combat Engineers from 1963 to 1977 and was discharged with the rank of Staff Sergeant. While in the service he attended many schools including the Senior Combat Engineer School and the noncommissioned officers school. He received many military awards including three Army Commendation Medals, two Air Medals, four Good Conduct Medals, the President Unit Citation, the Vietnam Cross of Gallantry medal, the Vietnam Service Medal with four Bronze Stars and the Vietnam Campaign Medal along with numerous other honors. His various military assignments included two tours in Vietnam.

Bill served as Post Adjutant and Club Manager at Barboursville Post No. 177 for 9 years and has been largely responsible for the membership growth of 60 to 611 members. He also served on the National Security Council and National Americanism Commission. Bill was appointed STATE Department Adjutant January 1, 1993 where he is now currently serving.

Bill is a Life member of the 25th Infantry Division Association, a Life member of The American Legion and the VFW, 4th Infantry Division Association, Elks Lodge 313, member of the Loyal Order of the Moose, the 40/8 Voiture 1036 and is a Kentucky Colonel.

He is married to Pamela Kay Johnson. His family consists of one daughter, one son, one step daughter and three grandchildren AND 2 breat GRANDChrister

Bill has been very supportive of the Boys' State program. He started a fund raiser in 1995-96 by encouraging the sale of Boys' State Decals. All occasion cards are now sold for donations. Bill gets soft drink donations and supplies soft drinks for Boys' State staff members all week. He helps secure Boys' State funding from the Legislature and was partly responsible for extending Boys' State to Saturday instead of closing the camp on Friday





LARRY V. STARCHER was born in Roane County and graduated from Spencer High School in 1960. Earned his A.B. in political science and a J.D. degree from West Virginia University, graduating with honors. Served as an assistant to the West Virginia University Vice-President for Off-Campus Education, Director of the North Central West Virginia Legal Aid Society and engaged in the private practice of law. After serving on the Morgantown City Council (1970-72) he was elected Circuit Judge in Monongalia County in 1976. He was Chief Judge in his circuit for 6 his 20 years on the bench. Has held all offices in the West Virginia Judicial Association and was a fellow of the National Endowment for the Humanities at Harvard University in 1978. He has been a teaching judge with the Judicial Association, the State Bar, National Judicial College and has been an Adjunct Lecturer at the WVU College of Law for several years. Married to Rebecca Wiles Starcher of Fairmont; three children, Mollianne, Victor and Amy.



GLEN B. GAINER III (D) of Wood County, was born February 26, 1960, to Sally J. and Glen B. Gainer, Jr. Married to the former Susan A. Ryder; two children. Educated in the Wood County public school system, graduating from Parkersburg High School; earned a Bachelor's Degree in Political Science at the University of Charleston, and attended the Washington Center for Learning, serving as Democratic Congressional Campaign Committee Intern. Served in the State Treasurer's Office from 1985 through 1989; served as budget Director for the West Virginia Department of Energy from 1989 through 1991; and served as National Accounts Representative for the John Deere & Company from 1991 through 1992. Southeastern states Director, Vice Chairman of the Board of Directors, and Chairman of the 2002 Committee of the National White Collar Crime Center. Vice chairman of the Consolidated Public Retirement Board. Trustee of the West Virginia Investment Management Board and Chairman of its Audit Committee. Member, Board of Public Works, Armory Board and Board of Trustees, State Municipal Bond Commission, Land Sales and Condominiums. Listed in Who's Who in American Politics. Dr. Troy Stewart Speaks At Evening Meal

Dr. Troy Stewart, Chairman of the Political Science Department of Marshall University spoke to the citizens of Mountaineer Boys' State at the evening meal on Wednesday. Dr Stewart told the citizens that he firmly believes that democracy is the greatest form of government. He expressed his fear that we might lose this form of government through apathy. He explained that politics is the allocation of scarce resources and that the challenge is not to decide right from wrong because that would be easy. The true challenge is to decided between worthy options and that takes leadership. Dr. Stewart stated that there is no higher calling than to get involved in public service and he encouraged the citizens to return to their homes and to accept that challenge.

Dr. Stewart was born and raised in Metheny in Wyoming County. After serving six years in the United States Army, he received his Bachelors Degree in Social Studies from Marshall University. He then received his Masters Degree in Political Science from Marshall. He went on to West Virginia University where he earned his Doctorate in Political Science. He has taught at Marshall University since 1972, missing only two years. One year he worked for the Department of Defense and another year he spent at the College of Law at Oxford University. Dr. Stewart also represents all of higher education for the various legislative intern programs.

ROBERT EARL MAXWELL (D) of Elkins, was born on March 15, 1924, the son of Earl L. Maxwell and Nellie E. Maxwell; educated in Randolph County Schools and Davis and Elkins College, LLB College of Law, West Virginia University in 1949; married Ann Marie Grabowski in March, 1948; four children: Mary Ann, Carol Lynn, Ellen Lindsay and Earl Wilson. Commenced private practice of law in Randolph County June 1, 1949; Member of Randolph County Bar Association, the West Virginia State Bar, the West Virginia Bar Association, American Bar Association and American Judicature Society, Catholic. Elected Prosecuting Attorney of Randolph County in 1952, reelected 1956 and 1964; president United States Attorney for the Northern District of West Virginia by President President Johnson on July 19, 1965, as Judge of the United States District Court for the Northern District of West Virginia President, District Judges' Association, Fourth Circuit; 1969 recipient Alumni Distinguished Scrvice Award from Davis and Elkins College; 1979 recipient of Outstanding Community Leadership award of Religious Heritage of America; 1989 recipient of Order of Vandalia Award, West Virginia University, 1991 recipient of Merit Award, Davis and Elkins College Beta Alpha Beta; West Virginia University, May 14, 1994; Elkins-Randolph County Chamber of Commerce 1994 Citizen of the Year Award; 1996 recipient of the Distinguished Citizen Award from the Allohak Council, Boy Scouts of America; Board of Advisors, Mary Babb Randolph Cancer Center, West Virginia University.


Meet the WVU Mountaineer!
